RULES & REGULATIONS

1. Exhibitor rules #1-40 where applicable.
2. In making entries, the owner's name, address in full, the exact age of the animal, its name, registration number, names of sire and dam, must be given on the livestock entry card - no other forms are acceptable. Names and numbers of animals competing for Herd and Progeny Prizes must be given before judging of respective classes commence or prizes will be withheld.
3. Holsteins arrive Friday, September 16, 2016 before 10:00am. Exhibitors report to barn superintendent before unloading.
Departure after 9:00pm Friday, September 16, 2016. All cattle must be on grounds from arrival time as printed above until leaving time as printed or exhibitor will forfeit 50% of prize money awarded.
4. Calf club (4-H) entries are to be on grounds by 8:00am Saturday, September 17, 2016.
5. All cattle entered in graded herds and groups must also be entered as single animals and shown in classes to which they belong.

6. Females over 36 months of age must show signs of pregnancy or be giving milk at time of fair. In the event of a dry cow freshening after entry has been made, a post entry will be accepted for the class in milk to which she belongs.
7. Any animal showing evidence of faking will be disqualified and exhibitor will forfeit all prize monies. It will be reported to Canadian Assoc. of Exhibitions & Secretary of Canadian Record Association for the breed. The Kingston & District Agricultural Society is not responsible for the consequences, directly / indirectly, of any animal or exhibitor being disqualified/debarred from showing.
8. For the Kingston & District Agricultural Society's purpose faking consists of any practice or operation materially altering the structure of the natural conformation of any part of the animal's body, or effacing some defect: example, udder inflation; the introduction of air, liquids or any other substances subcutaneously in any part of the body; surgical operations to correct defects or the performance of any act or operation to exaggerate the natural conformation of any animal. Treatment of hair and horns excluded. For the proper carrying out of this rule, a Judge or the Chairman of the Cattle Committee may take the opinion of an Official Veterinarian of the Agricultural Society, or the Board of Directors may make any provision they deem advisable.
9. Exhibitors will be required to parade prize-winning animals for showmanship class if requested to do so by committee in charge.
10. All entries must be owned in whole or in part by a member of the Frontenac Holstein Club.
11. The 10 animals out of 15 placing the highest can be used for points in the Premier Breeder and Exhibitor awards.
12. Maximum total head eligible to enter from a breeding unit is 15, including 4-H exhibitors, in the open class with no restrictions on the number of entries per class.
13. Prize money will be paid through Frontenac Holstein Club.
14. All animals shown must have EZ-IR tags.

Code of Ethics Dairy Cattle Exhibitors

Part 1

While presenting a positive image to spectators, the following supports good animal husbandry both at home and at a show. The following practices or procedures are considered unacceptable and defined as being unethical in the show ring of registered dairy cattle.

1. Misrepresenting the age of the animal for the class in which it is shown.
2. Filling an animal unnaturally with liquid (tubing).
3. Balancing the udder by any means other than by leaving naturally produced milk in any or all quarters.
4. Treating the udder, internally or externally with an irritant, counter-irritant, or any substance to temporarily improve conformation or produce unnatural animation.
5. Administering epidural anesthesia (blocking tails)
6. Performing surgery of any kind to change the natural contour of appearance of the animal's body, hide or hair. Not included is the removal of warts, teats & horns, clipping & dressing of hair and trimming of hooves.
7. Inserting foreign material/articles under the skin into the top line, or on the feet.
8. Roping udders.
9. Criticizing or interfering with the judge show management or other exhibitors while in the show ring or other conducts detrimental to the breed or show.

Part 2

The provisions of this part apply to entries of a breed regulated by a breed association, which has adopted this part.

1. If intended for use in contravention of the Code of Ethics, no exhibitor and no agent, employee or other person acting on behalf of an exhibitor, shall have in his or her possession or control any hypodermic syringe, needle, or other device, swabs, cloths, or other material, or any medicine, preparation or substance, whether in liquid or any other form.
2. Exhibitors will not be allowed to wrap hocks or drain fluid from hocks at a show unless authorized by a veterinarian at the show.
3. All entries and the personal property of all exhibitors, their servants and agents and persons acting on behalf of exhibitors, are subject to inspection by Frontenac County Ethics Committee members. All such persons shall cooperate with the Frontenac County Ethics Committee members and shall provide all such information in connection with such inspections and shall provide access to the animal and all information reasonably required by inspectors in connection with such inspections and shall provide, if so requested, samples of urine and blood suitable for analysis.
Exhibitors shall also remove any udder supports, blankets or other objects limiting the ability of the Frontenac County Ethics Committee members to undertake thorough inspection. In particular, the Frontenac County Ethics Committee members shall be informed, in advance of the nature of any

medicine, treatment or substance administered to any entry and the reasons therefore. Inspections under this paragraph may be carried out at any time while the animal is at the show and elsewhere in the period ending 30 days after the termination of the show between the hours of 6:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m.

4. Any Frontenac County Ethics Committee member may, at any time, require the delivery to him/her of any hypodermic syringe, needle or other device, swabs, cloths or other material, or samples or any other form, in the possession or control of the exhibitor, his servants, agents or persons acting on behalf of the exhibitor for the purposes of laboratory analysis.
5. (A) Subject to the provisions of subparagraph (B), the following entries are disqualified and shall not participate further in the show in which the entry is disqualified.
 - (i) Any animal, determined by a veterinarian (at the request of the Frontenac County Ethics Committee), to have an udder manifesting any of the following: localized swelling, edema, erythema, sensitivity, reddening, firmness, warmth or exfoliation of the skin but excluding general edema associated with parturition or mastitis, or a sore in the area where the large blood vessels enter the udder.
 - (ii) Any animal entered by an exhibitor whose servants, agents or persons acting on his behalf, fails to cooperate in the inspection provided for under paragraphs 3 or 4.
- (B) The Frontenac County Ethics Committee's determination pursuant to Subparagraph (A) (1) is subject to an appeal by the exhibitor to the appeal committee appointed by the show for the purpose. Any such appeal must be made by notice in writing delivered to the show management within one hour of notification of the inspector's determination.

Entry Closing Date: Friday, 3weeks prior to show day

1. **Novice Class (or pre 4H).** Child not eligible for 4-H. Resident of Frontenac County. Holsteins only: calf born on or after Mar. 1, 2016. Special prize for each exhibitor. **Note:** All animals to be on grounds by 4:00pm to be checked for registration certificates.
2. **Summer Calf** – Born June 1, 2016 – Aug. 31, 2016
3. **Junior Calf** - Born Mar. 1, 2016 - May 31, 2016
4. **Intermediate Calf** - Born - Born Dec. 1, 2015- Feb. 29, 2016
5. **Senior Calf** - Born Sept. 1, 2015 - Nov. 30, 2015
6. **Summer Yearling** - Born June 1, 2015 - Aug. 31, 2015
7. **Junior Yearling** - Born Mar. 1, 2015 - May 31, 2015

Special:Morley Curtis Memorial 4-H Championship – open to top two Frontenac 4-H calves from classes 2 to 6 (as shown by Frontenac Dairy 4-H member). Medal and cash prize for Grand, Reserve and Honourable Mention.

8. **Senior Yearling** – Born Sept 1, 2014 - Feb. 29, 2015
(Note: Milking yearlings are to show in the junior 2-yr. old class. Placing will be recorded for nomination purposes)
9. **Female - Junior & Reserve Junior Champion (Ribbon Class)**
10. **Junior Breeders Herd** -Group of 3 female owned & bred by Exhibitor (not in milk). Ribbons ONLY.

****2 year old and 3 year old class will only be split if need be****

11. **Female – Junior 2 year old, in milk or dry**
Born Mar 1,2014 - Aug. 31, 2014
12. **Female – Senior 2 year old, in milk or dry**
Born Sept. 1, 2013 to Feb 28 2014
13. **Female - 3 year old, in milk, or dry**
Born Sept. 1, 2012 - Aug. 31, 2013
If dry must be within approx. 8 weeks of calving

14. **Female - 4 year old, in milk, or dry**
Born Sept. 1, 2011 - Aug. 31, 2012
If dry must be within approx. 8 weeks of calving
15. **Female - 5 year old, in milk or dry**
Born Sept. 1, 2010 - Aug. 31, 2011
If dry must be within approx. 8 weeks of calving.
16. **Female - Mature cow, in milk or dry**
Born prior to Sept. 1, 2010
If dry must be within approx. 8 weeks of calving.
17. **Female - Grand & Reserve Grand Champion (Ribbon Class)**
18. **Best Udder**
19. **Breeder's Herd** (bred by the Exhibitor). A group of 3 animals limited to one exhibit per exhibitor. The Exhibitor must have bred all 3 animals and own or jointly own at least one animal in the group; the other two animals in the group may be owned by other exhibitors.

readily determined in all identified cases from Certificate of Registry, either directly from the breeder section or, in the case of a within-herd family transfer with alphanumeric c code, by utilization of the animal's prefix or, from animals carrying the same prefix. In the case of jointly-bred animals, **a joint breeding unit** may be counted as a separate group for the Premier Breeder if the breeders wish to. Notice must be given to the Holstein Field Rep prior to the show to prepare for proper calculation of the points. If not, the points will be awarded to the exhibitor whose prefix is on the animal at the time of the show. In case of any ownership changes during the show, ownership at final placement within class will be used to calculate points.
