General Rules and Regulations
Kingston & District Agricultural Society (KDAS)
Kingston Fall Fair Horse Shows
September 15th-18th, 2016

1. All competitors/exhibitors **MUST** be fully paid up members of the KDAS for the current year. Adults \$7.00 Youth (under 18) \$1.00. **Membership to be paid with entries.**
 2. Entries are not considered complete without a correctly signed liability waiver form, proof of liability insurance on the horse (proof must be in the form of a current OEF membership or insurance agreement), and payment in full. All cheques to be made payable to “KDAS”.
 3. **REFUNDS:** KDAS membership fee is non-refundable. Entry fees will be returned if cancelled 24 hours prior to first class entered with appropriate medical documentation. Once a horse has entered the show grounds there will be no refund unless authorized by the Kingston Fall Fair Horse Show Committee Chair.
 4. All **NO SHOW** entries will be charged full entry fees and other applicable fees.
 5. A \$50.00 charge will be added to all accounts paid with cheques that are returned from the bank for any reason.
 6. Show management reserves the right to change or amend show scheduling up to one-half (1/2) hour prior to the designated class. All classes will be offered. Show management reserves the right to not award prize money for any class that has three (3) entries or less two hours before the show is scheduled to start.
 7. English: Proper hunter show attire is mandatory. Well-heeled field boots or paddock boots with half chaps. All competitors **MUST** wear a correctly fastened ASTM/SEI approved helmet.
 8. Western: Correct western attire, western boots, long or short sleeved shirts allowed and Western hat. Competitors under 18 years of age **MUST** wear a correctly fastened ASTM/SEI approved helmet.
 9. There will be a 10 minute warning call before the start of classes. Failure to come to the in gate will result in elimination, without refund of entry fee.
 10. Warm up in the Memorial Centre is open to any competitor competing on that day, but is restricted to the official hours. Entry numbers must be worn at all times.
 11. **AGE DIVISIONS** – Please refer to individual class lists. Proof of age may be requested by the Committee.
 12. **ALL PRIZE MONEY WILL BE AWARDED THE DAY OF THE SHOW.**

2. Limited to ten (10) entries.
3. Top five (5) riders may be called back for a second round (time permitting)

11:00 am Class 2 OPEN DIVISION

1. Riders over 18 years of age as of January 1, 2016
2. Limited to fifteen (15) entries.
3. Top eight (8) will be called back for a second round (time permitting)

OBSTACLE RACE RULES:

Category 1 & 2:

Entry fee is \$25.00 and the entry money for each category will be pooled and paid back at 40%, 30%, 20% and 10%. Ribbons presented to 5th place. At the discretion of the Kingston Agricultural Society, there may be added money to the prize money paid out.

All competitors must pay a \$7.00 membership fee and provide proof of liability insurance. The obstacles to be attempted will differ for each division, with the degree of difficulty higher for the Category 2 entries.

Obstacles to be expected may include the following: open and close gate; ride through a curtain; noodle monster; bridge; carry items (pail, tarp etc); walk over tarp; jump a log; sidepass rails; back through patterns; pull a rail; etc. The riders are expected to demonstrate good horsemanship and safe riding. Each obstacle is judged, and the course is timed.

RULES:

1. All competitors are expected to compete within their capabilities;
2. Western or English tack is acceptable. The rider must realize that not using a western saddle may affect their ability to complete some obstacles properly;
3. This event is a judged and timed event. Failure to complete the entire course in a specified amount of time will result in disqualification;
4. Order of go will be drawn fifteen (15) minutes prior to the competition;
5. Points will be awarded for each obstacle on a scale of 1 – 10 based on the horse's attitude, the rider's horsemanship and the ability to complete the obstacle properly;
6. Contestants are required to complete each obstacle within a thirty (30) second time limit, or they will be directed to the next obstacle.
7. Any rider who falls off their horse during the course will have one (1) minute to catch and remount without any assistance.
8. The competitors will be allowed to walk or ride their horses in the arena prior to the start of the competition. There will be a 15 minute limit and no obstacles will be approached or practised during this time. There will be an opportunity to ask questions of the judge regarding the course and obstacles.
9. Any outside distractions such as spectators, noises etc. will be considered part of the course and each contestant must understand that this is considered "the luck of the draw".
10. At the judge's discretion, a contestant may be issued a re-ride should an outside distraction from beyond the course be so great as to inhibit the contestant from having a fair opportunity to compete. Re-rides will take place after the final contestant.
11. All obstacles must be attempted by each competitor. If a contestant goes off course and skips an obstacle, they will be disqualified. There will be no direction from the judges or ring crew if an obstacle is missed.
12. Proper riding attire is required, suited to the tack used. All contestants aged 18 and under MUST wear an approved riding helmet. It is strongly recommended that all contestants wear a riding helmet. Horses are permitted to wear protective leg gear. There will be no mechanical hackamores, tie downs, nosebands or cavessons. The Judge will evaluate each horse's tack as it enters the ring. No modifications can be made to tack to aid in the competition. No crops are allowed.
13. Any dispute or complaint by a contestant must be brought to the attention of the judge/official timer before the contestant leaves the course area. All contestants will accept the judge's decision as final, and are not subject to appeal.

14. There will be an official timer and back up timer. The timer's records are final and may not be contested. Should all times fail, the contestant will receive a re-ride at the end of the class.
15. Overall ride times will be allotted additional points in accordance to the following criteria:
fastest run: 5 pts.; 2nd fastest run: 4 pts; 3rd fastest run: 3 points; 4th fastest run: 2 points; 5th fastest run: 1 point.
16. There will be a minimum of 10 obstacles in the Thursday evening competition and a minimum of 13 in the Friday competition;
17. In the event of a tie between the top places at the end of the class, the winner will be determined by the fastest run.
18. Any breed of horse or pony is permitted. No stallions may be ridden by anyone under the age of 18.
19. Mistreatment of any horse or pony is not permitted. Failure to comply will result in disqualification. Any horse or pony determined to be lame at the time of competition will be disqualified.

All competitors are required to be members of the KDAS with a current fully paid membership and must show proof of \$2,000,000.00 liability on their team. Competition will follow the rules and regulations of the Ottawa Valley Horse Drawing Association.

Rules & class list/description

1. **Entry Fee** is \$5.00 per class, or a flat fee of \$50.00 for all classes. Payable by: cash, E-transfer or cheque. Make cheque payable to: Kingston District Agricultural Society ... mailing address: P.Allison 2354 Bur Brook Rd Kingston on K7L 4V4, cheques must be post dated/received no later than Monday Sept 12th, 2016... (E-transfer s will be accepted no later than 5pm Monday Sept 12th, 2016) pallison@hotmail.ca
2. The contact person for entry forms and general inquiries is Pauline Allison. Forms can be emailed to pallison@hotmail.ca
3. **Entry forms** must be submitted by 5pm Monday September 12th, and paid in full by 8:00am the day of the show. (**Cash only will be accepted the day of the show**) Riders with incomplete forms or unpaid fees will not be permitted to participate *** Entries will be limited to 15/class***
4. **Show attire:** any accepted gaited horse show attire is allowed, as long as tack and rider follow the turnout rules for their chosen discipline. As an example, if you are going to show in English tack, then standard English show attire should be worn (breeches, tall boots, jacket, etc) the same goes for Western, Hunt Seat, Paso Pleasure, etc. *** Working/Performance class will be shown in formal attire: black pants (black jeans accepted if showing in western attire) black dress pants accepted if showing English, Paso pleasure or Hunt seat, white dress shirt(LS) or blouse(LS), black(tuxedo style) vest or jacket (Bolero or English) & either black or white saddle pad.
5. All classes are open to mares, geldings or stallions of any age.
6. **Prizes:** most classes will be awarded the following unless otherwise noted in the class description:
 1. 1st place - \$20.00
 2. 2nd place - \$15.00
 3. 3rd place - \$10.00
 4. 4th place - \$5.00
 5. 5th place – ribbon only
7. **Class list:**
 1. Conformation – horse is shown in-hand in bridle (money prize) & 1st place prize TBA
 2. Bareback – riders perform walk, show gaits, and pleasure gaits, without saddle , horse must stand quietly & back readily (money prize) 1st place prize TBA
 3. English Pleasure– riders in English attire/tack (includes Hunt seat) perform pleasure gaits, horse must stand quietly & back readily. (money prize) & 1st place prize TBA
 4. Western Pleasure – riders in western attire/tack (includes Paso pleasure) perform pleasure gaits, horse must stand quietly & back readily (money prize) 1st place prize TBA

5. Command Class– riders must execute gaits & manoeuvres with precision & control, winner determined by elimination process (1s place only, money prize) & prize TBA
 6. Open Equitation– rider is judged on ability & deportment, horse must stand quietly & back readily (money prize) & 1st place prize TBA
 7. Working Performance – riders perform show/performance gaits, horse must stand quietly & back readily (money prize) & 1st place prize TBA
 8. Challenge of the Breeds – 1st place only, awarded to the horse & rider that best represents their breed, horse must stand quietly & back readily , Must be entered in @ least 3 of the following classes to be eligible : 1,2,3,4,5,6,7. (money prize) & 1st place prize TBA
 9. Costume Class – both rider & horse must have a costume element, costume cannot impede the horses movement in any way or cause distraction to other riders/horses, (ribbon only) & 1st place prize TBA
 10. Champagne Class– rider perform various gaits while carrying a glass of “champagne”...rider with the most liquid in their cup wins (1st place ribbon only) 1st place prize TBA
 11. Egg and Spoon – riders carry egg on a spoon while performing various gaits (ribbon only) & 1st place prize TBA
 12. Ribbon ride – riders pair off and carry a ribbon while performing various gaits (ribbon only) & 1st place pair each receive prize TBA
 13. Panty raid – done in heats, riders must ride to a designated point, get off their horses, put on some granny panties, get back on their horse wearing their granny panties & ride back, first across the finish line is the winner, 1st place only (ribbon only) & prize TBA
 14. Obstacles – horse and rider attempt to negotiate various trail obstacles. Judged on points, maximum 2 points per obstacle, time limit of 30 seconds for each attempt (judge’s decision is final). The obstacle course with a description of each obstacle will be posted on the day of the show (money prize) 1st place prize TBA
8. A high point cooler donated by Wilton Tack will be presented to the horse and rider who accumulated the most points over the course of the show.
 9. Judges choice: Judge will choose a horse/rider of her liking (must have shown in three of the following classes : 1,2,3,4,5,6,7,8 to be eligible) Prize TBA
 10. Riders choice award: riders will choose a horse/rider team of their liking (prize TBA)
 11. Riders under 18 years of age must wear an ASTM approved equestrian helmet while mounted.
 12. All competitors must be fully paid up members of KDAS for the current year...adults \$7**, youth (18 & under) \$1** to be paid with entry fees.
 13. Entries are not considered complete without a correctly signed liability waiver, proof of liability insurance on the horse (OEF or comparable insurance) & payment in full. Cheques made payable to : Kingston District Agricultural Society (KDAS)
 14. Refunds: KDAS membership fee is non-refundable. Entry fees will only be returned if cancelled 24 hours prior to the first class & with appropriate medical documentation. Once a horse has entered the show grounds there will be no refund unless authorized by Kingston Fall Fair Horse Show Committee chair.
 15. All NO SHOW entries will be charged full entry fees & other applicable fees.

8. Horse and rider combination can do a maximum of two divisions; the second division is not to be more than *one* division higher. The horse is allowed a total of 4 entries during the day. If a horse is entered twice (or more) in a division, only the first rider in the ring will be eligible for ribbons, second rider in the division on the same horse will NOT be eligible for prize money or ribbons.
9. Divisions may be cancelled due to low entries at the discretion of the Kingston District Agricultural Society.
10. **Safety vest** is to be worn by riders when mounted in the ring for warm up and competition.
11. **Medical arm bands** are to be clearly displayed on the **LEFT ARM**, nowhere else will be accepted. These are to be worn in warm up as well.
12. Riders are not permitted to wear tank tops in the ring. Shirts with sleeves are required.
13. Riders are to clearly display numbers on their backs at all times.
14. Standing martingales are not permitted. Running martingales are allowed.
15. Times and winners based on optimum time allowed. Times and distance of courses TBA
